1200 Beach Blvd. Jacksonville, FL

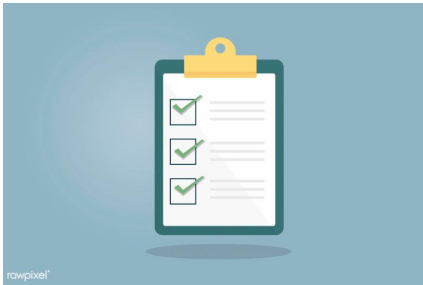

Last month ElderSource and the Jacksonville Public Library hosted a free community workshop on elder abuse prevention in recognition of World Elder Abuse Awareness Day, June 15. More than 100 people attended the workshop held at the Jacksonville Public Library Beaches Branch.

Special guests included: Ken Amaro, Consumer Advocate Reporter for First Coast News and Justine Conley, Associate Director with AARP Florida. Speakers offered interactive presentations on how to avoid becoming a victim of elder abuse and financial scams. A Q&A session gave participants an opportunity to dialogue about current issues and concerns of financial scams and elder abuse. With this unexpected assistance, they were able to have the huge trees removed, just in time before the current hurricane season began.

It's Hurricane Season: Is Your Emergency Supply-Kit Ready?

Hurricane season began June 1st and runs through November 30th. We hope you have a

plan in place and have prepared as much as possible before a storm hits. One of the things you can do, along with creating a safety plan, is to create an emergency supply kit.

Here is a list of suggested items to include:

- Nonperishable food items (enough to last for 3 days or more)
- First aid kit
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Water (drinking and sanitation, 1 gallon per person, per day for 3 days or more)
- Prescription and medications
